6. Group Work

Housing & Design – James Cosgrave, Clare Norton, Julia Marshall, (Steve & Romaine Watkins)

Discussion: If school relocated, where would it go? Don't want to lose community space in centre of village. Possible site at end of Green Lane.

Large village. Need more housing that's affordable & high quality, range of types and sizes, for families, old and young people. Open to different designs — innovation. Self-build projects on council owned land. Repurpose existing buildings. Safe cycling/walking route to Hemel station & secondary schools.

Parking for shoppers – limited stay

Avoid solving one problem and creating another.

Transport & Traffic – Paul Campbell, Dave Ewington, Ben Richardson, Ros Goodyear Bovingdon roads very busy. Problems with HGV & commercial vehicles - Bypass across airfield? Serious lack of parking: **High St** – parents (early for spaces), initiatives – Park & Stride, bad parking, Saturday parking in school not widely known; **Residential roads** – number of vehicles per household (work + personal). People take advantage of free parking for long periods

Maintenance of sight lines on narrow roads Green Lane (Docks) & Vicarage Rd hedges (White House) – safety issue.

Traffic regs. not enforced - Existing double yellow lines – lack of signage Café users parking on zigzag lines
Step by step approach to complex issues

Unattractive shop fronts – need to improve appearance of the High St Parking is a major issue

Public realm to create a social aspect

80 businesses in Bovingdon – can't expand until infrastructure improved Connectivity issues – improve Wi-Fi – (Cloud: village Wi-Fi)

Encourage working from home

People shop where parking easy – village loses out on business

Community Facilities – Anne Barrett, Gary Gadstone, John Hislam, Jenny Thomas School engagement to be a focus, engage parents of Nursery/reception children. More houses = pressure on school places: Expansion or new school on larger site? Football club may want to relocate to a larger site away from houses; free up land for allotments &/or expand tennis club.

Relocate Bowls Club – free up space for parking in centre of village.

Need cycle racks in village, lack of provision for teenagers/older children,

Older groups – lack of volunteers & inadequate facilities.

Opportunities for intergenerational groups to be formed & thrive.

Collect data on community groups – audit of facilities.
