<u>Happy 100th Birthday — Bovingdon Memorial Hall</u>

100 years ago on 21st April 1921 the piece of land, which the Bovingdon Memorial Hall sits on, was gifted to Bovingdon Parish Council by the Ryder family who gave the village an acre of land on which to build a Memorial Hall after the First World War.



Mr Whichello who lived at Bovingdon Grange, said that if the village could raise £1,000 he would match it with a further

£1,000. The villagers formed a hall committee and successfully raised the required money so plans for the hall were drawn up. In the light of these plans Mr Whichello decided to increase his donation to £2,000 to fund the substantial building we have today. The Memorial Hall was built in 1921 at a cost of £3,000 with the money raised by public subscription and the generous donation of Mr Whichello.



Chairman's Report

When you read this Easter will have passed and hopefully we will all be looking forward to a more normal and well-deserved summer



The Parish Office still remains closed with all Parish Council personnel working from home. The Memorial Hall has also remained closed other than for use by the Bovingdon Pre-School and the NHS Blood Transfusion Service.



All Council meetings have taken place, and will continue to take place via Zoom, for the foreseeable future. Members of the public can access Council meetings via the link that is on the respective meeting agenda on the Parish website. When you join a meeting you will be asked to identify yourself. The Annual Meeting of the Parish Council will take place on Tuesday 4th May and again members of the public are welcome to attend.

In respect of future events unfortunately there is not much to relate, however please see separate article (in the centre pages of this issue) from Richard Taylor regarding the annual Bovingdon 10K and Fun Run races.

General maintenance work and litter picking continues to be carried out in the Parish by Sunnyside Rural Trust and separately we have awarded them a contract to clean up the pond on Bovingdon Green. This will involve removing a large area of iris plants to enable the pond to re-establish its water surface area. The removed vegetation will be placed at the pond edge to ensure any disturbed creatures can return to the pond.

Flooding at the bottom of Green Lane with the junction of Ley Hill Road has been a recurring problem over the winter months. The Parish Council has had discussions with

representatives from Hertfordshire
Highways about this issue and
we understand that they will be
undertaking further investigations in the
near future. In addition, we understand
that proposals made by the potential
developers of the land at Grange Farm
would incorporate flood mitigation
measures that would permanently
alleviate flooding at this location.



The Parish Council has also had several discussions with Hertfordshire Highways about carrying out improvements to the parking outside the Co-Op and Jarmans. A scheme of improvement to this area is currently being refined and we are hopeful that improvements will be carried out during this financial year.

Planning Committee Report

I reported in October that the Dacorum Draft Local Plan was scheduled to go out for consultation in November 2020, which it duly did and was held open for comment over an extended period, which ended on 28th February 2021. We understand that there have been a great number of comments from across the Borough that are now being analysed and should be reported on in early summer.

Work has continued on the Neighbourhood Plan by a dedicated group of volunteers, please see the separate report on progress from Councillor Julia Marshall who is leading this project.

In respect of planning within the village there have not been any notable new applications however there are currently three applications, which are subject to appeal. The first is an appeal by the operators of Bovingdon Market where they are seeking to vary the planning permission in respect of the designated parking area and the area of market operation. The Parish Council has objected to both variations, as we believe, if granted, this would exasperate what is already an overcrowded venue that adversely impacts on village life, particularly around the Christmas period. The operators of Drift Limits have lodged the other two appeals where they are seeking to remove a condition that gave them planning permission that was limited to two years. They are also seeking to vary a further condition that relates to their management plan.

County Report

A sobering milestone this week when we reflected on the losses from COVID-19 and the devastating impact of this horrible disease. We are still some way off understanding why some people are so poorly, young and old, and others just



sail through. The good news is that half the country has now been jabbed and in care settings the rate is over 90%. Visiting in care homes is now happening and I hope all our freedoms to get out and about and live life to the full, will move into a more normal phase this summer. Remember some people have been shielded and isolated for a long time: go and say hello when you can. To our volunteers, care staff and nurses who have been working flat out and trussed up in PPE, thank you again.

By the time you read this we will have had elections for the County Council and the Police and Crime Commissioner. The County Council ward I have represented for the past four years covers Bovingdon, Chipperfield, Flaunden, Felden, Bourne End and Kings Langley, it has been a privilege to represent you and I hope you can see that working with Borough and Parish Councillors we have got a few things done. Over that time each Councillor has had direct control for their ward of £360k of highway budget and £45k to support local community causes, including this year for COVID-19 support.

Now I know Shantock Hall Lane is trashed by the chicken farm lorries and we will have to do something serious to sort that out but do ask, anything and everything, it's never too soon then it can be planned and programmed.

In the next few years the most difficult challenge for local Government will be landing the planned development locally. We now have the Dacorum cabinet lead for planning under Alan Anderson and for all things Environment under Graham, I look forward to working with both, as they tackle the things that matter most to many people.

I have been asked to look at replacing some very big trees on narrow roads, nobody likes trees being lost, so no loss without replacement but I do understand that reduced light and homes threatened by tree roots is a problem. We can work through this carefully with the support of residents.

Slightly further afield I am worried about the proposed MOTO service station planned for the other side of the M25 next to Kings Langley and will be speaking to Grant Shapps to ask that this be dismissed, I foresee chaos if this goes ahead. Likewise, in Winkwell I have put funding aside to get the rat-run from Chaulden Lane blocked off.

Dealing with surface water will be a very serious priority for the next four years, building on the good drainage work in Ryder Close, sorting out Green Lane and the water that flows towards The Moody Estate. This year the County Council agreed to increase the drainage budget by £10m to support flood prevention.

The County budget agreed in February also put £10million aside to support safer road speeds, walking and cycling, not for the sake of clamping down on motorists but to make our villages more pleasant to live in.

This past year has been a challenging one for the Steering Group, In common with many groups, we have been unable to meet in person and this has meant all our meetings have been held online via Zoom. Our group has reduced further under these difficulties and we now have a small band of dedicated volunteers, who have worked hard to keep the project on course.



We have continued to work on the Neighbourhood Plan, writing policies and assessing potential housing sites, but progress has slowed down considerably. Unfortunately, restrictions have also meant that the consultation on our draft policies, which we had planned to hold in the Memorial Hall at the end of last year, has had to be delayed and alternative means sought to consult with residents and canvass their opinions.

We are currently working with West Herts College students to produce an online presentation for residents, which will set out our draft policies, and I am hopeful that this will be up and running by the end of April. Views and feedback from residents will be invited.

We will publish the presentation, policies and a link to a brief survey of residents' views on the Parish Council website (www.bovingdonparishcouncil.gov.uk/Neighbourhood_Plan). Please check the Bovingdon Parish Council website and Facebook pages for details.

Relax Rebalance Reset





It was late summer when I wrote the last Bovingdon News article and we were then enjoying relative freedom and seemed on track to enjoy a very Merry Christmas. Little did we know how things would change! The first casualty was our annual social evening in November. Since then we have had to cancel both of our Spring talks and the Spring Show. Until the relaxing of restrictions on meetings the social side of our activities will sadly have to stay on hold.

Fortunately nature cannot be put on hold and, as the spring advances, we are able to return to our gardens with the hope that by summer we will able to socialise once more.



Not all of our activities have been curtailed and in November our annual seed order to Thompson & Morgan went ahead as usual. This year was the biggest for some time, over £500, boosted no doubt by more of our members wanting to grow their own vegetables. Following on from the seed buving we are now awaiting our bulk order of composts that we have delivered by lorry in mid-March.

With restrictions possibly easing by late May we are planning to stage our Summer Show on 26th June; if the Memorial Hall is open. We have kept the schedule from last summer's cancelled show and if you are interested in entering any exhibits the details will be on our website (www.bovingdonhortsoc.org.uk). We have moved the paintings section from the Spring Show to the Summer Show to allow artists to show their lockdown masterpieces; subjects for the painting classes will be the same as appeared in the 2020 handbook with the addition of three further subjects for paintings. Therefore the six subjects to paint are: Vintage, Seascape, Nature's Patterns, A Churchyard, A Portrait of a Person, A Country Post Box or Boxes. Photographs will be exhibited in the Summer Show as usual and the subjects are: Stones, Water, Sport and Happy Days (a collection of four photographs.)

Despite having to cancel the talks in the spring we have booked Nick Bailey for 3rd November to give us a talk: Reviving a Tired Garden. Some of you may not be familiar with the name but he often appears on *Gardener's World*. Nick is an enthusiastic plantsman and last year presented a TV programme on South African flowers. He is also a gardenmaker, author and speaker on TV and radio. He spent seven years as Head Gardener at the Chelsea Physic Garden where he restored and developed the plant collections. Tickets for this very special talk will be on sale in the summer and are available for nonmembers as well as our members.

We are all longing for escape from this lockdown but until then we will be resuming our normal activities in the garden. Lawns need mowing, seeds need sowing, weeds need hoeing and only severe weather will stop us gardeners from doing what we love.

In my piece for the last issue of Bovingdon News written in September 2020, I reflected on the sense of exile we had felt during the first lockdown as we were prevented from holding church services for the first time in 800 years. Then we had the second lockdown and, as I write, we are still in the third lockdown, hoping and praying that it is the final one.

Unable to welcome visitors to church in any number, we decided to take church outside instead. For as long as the weather held we had some wonderful outdoor Sunday services on the gravel by the south porch. As autumn drew on we moved back inside. with limited capacity, but with a number of people joining our worship via Zoom. For the big events, where we knew we couldn't fit everyone in, we improvised. We recorded a short but moving Remembrance Day Ceremony, with our friends at Bovingdon Baptist Church and representatives of the Parish Council and the Royal British Legion, which was (and still is) available on our YouTube channel. Prior to that we held our Hallowe'en Light Party outside, with lights and marquee kindly provided by Adam Cook from New Vision Effects. Over 70 families visited, we gave away more than 200 goodie bags and everyone said how much they appreciated enjoying 'the light which shines in the darkness'.

The Crib Service on Christmas Eve often attracts more than 150 people. As we couldn't hold this inside we organised instead a Walkabout Advent Calendar, publicised entirely through social media. So many people offered to put a Nativity image in their window that we were able to have two routes round the village, both with 23 windows. Small family parties could be seen wandering round Bovingdon with smart phones and calendars in their hands. Again over 200 people took part and over 50 of those came along to the churchyard on Christmas Eve to sing carols, collect a small prize and admire our nativity display and Christmas tree by the south porch.


We had planned an outdoor carol service but as Tier 3 gave way to Tier 4 we felt we had to cancel. Nevertheless we went ahead with outdoor carol singing on a bright and sunny Christmas morning, and many of our usual Christmas Day worshippers were able to come and sing their hearts out.

Through all of this time, the people of Bovingdon have responded generously to our support of DENS. So far our regular collections and deliveries have provided over one and a half tons of food for their Foodbank.

As winter turns to spring we are looking forward to returning to church for Mothering Sunday and Easter, and, after that, to a summer in which we can once again hold weddings, baptisms, our annual Summer Fête and many more events.

While this has been a time of sadness and isolation for many and of bereavement for those who have lost loved ones to the pandemic, our faith has shown us that God does not desert us in times of trouble. In the person of Jesus Christ he suffered and died for us, and was raised from the dead on Easter Day to show that sin, death and darkness can be overcome. At this time of year we celebrate Pentecost when God sent his Holy Spirit to quide and inspire us. As we emerge from the pandemic we pray that broken lives may be mended and that we may continue to find new ways to witness God's love and to serve the community in which we live.

At present our Community Library remains closed due to COVID-19. The main library in Hemel has re-opened but with restrictions, please refer to the Herts library website for more details (www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/services/libraries-and-archives.aspx).



Hopefully the risk assessment for our library will be complete by the time you are reading this. There are also plans for our library to be repainted and carpeted, as this has not been done since the library first opened on 4th July 1991. This is an ideal time for the work to be done rather than closing again later in the year for the works to be completed. Our volunteers are willing to come back as soon as the opportunity arises; when we re-open it will be with restricted hours at first and with new rules in place to ensure everyone's safety. This information will be advertised locally once we have more details.

Volunteering: We may also be looking for some new volunteers if you have a few hours to spare.

Local History: Unfortunately, this is all on hold at the moment, as no one is able to access the library. We will update you further in the next issue.

A group of ladybirds is called a loveliness and this certainly applies to Bovingdon Ladybirds Club.





News from Bovingdon Baptist Church

145 years of loving & serving God

Two years ago we began a new season of openness to God and to others with social activities in and around the village. We had groups as big as 15 on our 'Walk, Talk & Coffee' mornings, and people of all ages at Table Tennis club in the chapel on Sunday afternoons. Our quiz night saw the church packed with enthusiastic participants. We were delighted to welcome the wider Bovingdon community to these events and to Sunday services and midweek groups such as Coffee Morning and Youth Group. However, what 'walking together' looks like for our church family, friends and neighbours has changed dramatically since the Coronavirus pandemic struck.

Since the end of March 2020, we have held just two services inside our church building. Churches, like other organisations, have generally had to cease in-person meetings to protect the health of the vulnerable. However, we have found ways of adapting and new ways of supporting one another through these anxious times. We join together to worship God via video-conferencing. We have held prayer meetings, church business meetings, coffee mornings, social events and even our annual quiz online. We've got a weekly newsletter that gets delivered to the folk who can't access the internet. We've painted pebbles and hidden them around the village for schoolchildren to discover during the school holidays. And at Christmas we made 650 Make-a-Christingle at Home Kits and gave them away to the children at Bovingdon Primary Academy and Bovingdon Pre-School, and then to other friends and neighbours, brightening up their Christmas (and raising £300 for The Children's Society).

At our last in-person Coffee Morning in March 2020, we were brainstorming ideas of 'projects' to work on if and when we were locked down or self-isolating at home. Here's what we came up with...

- Reading library members are allowed up to 30 books out at any one time!
- Write your memoirs/family history/village history
- Organise your photos into albums or compile a book of photos for your family with captions/dates/names etc. If you find any photos which show Bovingdon village life in days gone by put them to one side to show the local history group
- Knit/crochet/paint/draw/do home crafts and hobbies
- Do jigsaws/puzzle books
- Phone someone, or try doing a video call (like Skype/WhatsApp)
- · Get into the garden and keep on top of the weeding and watering
- Try speaking to God and even spend a few minutes in quiet each day waiting for God to speak to you
- Listen to Sunday Worship on BBC Radio 4. Or visit a church website to find out about virtual worship services locally — or anywhere in the world! Our website is www. bovingdonbaptist.org.uk
- If you have a Bible, why not take it off the shelf, dust it down, and see what food for thought you might find there, what promises to give you hope?

A Life Story — Cardiff to Bovingdon in 93 years

I came up with the idea of writing my mum's life story back in April last year, partly as a way of filling our time together on my twice weekly visits during her COVID-enforced imprisonment in her flat for what we thought would be just a month or so...!



The target audience for the book is primarily mum's great and great-great grandchildren, most of whom know her well, but who live in a very different world to that which she was born into. However, you can't write about one person without including their relatives and friends to some degree. So we included what we knew, and researched about my Dad, and both their parents, siblings and their off-spring, which broadened the scope of the book making it more of a complete family history.

When we set out to write the story we didn't know what form it would take, nor if or how it would be published. However, it now exists as a 94-page A4 hard-back book of 21,000 words with key event photos as a permanent record for all the family.

The extended family members, who all got copies for Christmas, absolutely loved Mum's story and some of her words have since been included in a drama video that was jointly produced by Dacorum BC and Pursued By A Bear Productions about Hertfordshire womens' life experiences; she has also presented the war chapter to a pensioner's group meeting via Zoom. We have also heard that my son and daughter have both used the book for some bedtime stories for their children.... so the stories live on!

If anybody feels like tackling such a project I would be happy to give advice on how to go about it, plus I have some excellent local publishing contacts; so please get in touch.




activities which encouraged creativity, fun and ways to connect with family members. This was a great success and we were thrilled with how our pupils took to this and all the other initiatives.

Bovingdon History Group

Bovingdon History Group, like everyone else, has been unable to meet since March last year due to COVID-19. However, we are a group member of the Hertfordshire Association for Local History (HALH) and are invited to their annual Symposium. This lasts one day and a number of speakers are invited to address a theme of local historical interest. Last year's theme was *The Country House at War*, with a programme of four lectures

As a normal meeting could not be held, HALH asked each of the speakers to speak on one of four Zoom meetings held on Wednesday evenings last November. These were very successful, with over a hundred people joining each meeting.

The first lecture was by Helen Fry entitled *Trent Park: Home of the Secret Listeners* and was based on a book she has just published entitled *Walls Have Ears.* Trent Park was a large country house that was fitted out as comfortable quarters for captive high-ranking German officers with secret microphones in every room, enabling German-



speaking listeners in the basement to record and translate their conversations. A subtle approach by the officer in charge led to the generals being befriended and given alcohol. They were even taken shopping in Harrods and for afternoon tea at Simpson's and the Ritz. Over time the generals relaxed and began to discuss military matters with each other, revealing valuable information, including secret weapons, V1, V2 and V3. Latimer House was used in the same clandestine way, with microphones everywhere, including garden seats and trees.

The next lecture was given by Alistair Hodgson whose subject was *Salisbury Hall and* the de Havilland Aircraft Company. At the start of World War II the de Havilland company were building Tiger Moths as training aircraft for the RAF. As metals were scarce and expensive, Sir Geoffrey de Havilland obtained funding for a prototype fighter/bomber built from a balsa wood laminate. This revolutionary development had to be kept

secret so Salisbury Hall, near London Colney, was acquired for this. The prototype had to be stripped down and shipped by road to the de Havilland airfield at Hatfield then secretly re-assembled and test-flown. The trials were very successful, the aircraft designated as a Mosquito and large numbers built, making a vital contribution to our war effort. De Havilland sub-contracted the building of the laminated bodies to UK furniture manufacturers, and assembled the aircraft at Hatfield.



After the war Salisbury Hall become the first aircraft museum in this country with a Mosquito as a prize exhibit. There is a very interesting collection of other aircraft and memorabilia, many undergoing restoration. Our speaker is curator of the museum and is supported by an army of enthusiastic volunteers.

Bovingdon History Group (cont'd)

The third lecture was entitled *Poles Apart -The Story of Barnes Lodge, Kings Langley in World War II* and was given by Roger Yapp. Members of the Polish Radio and Intelligence Services escaped from Poland at the start of the war and were initially accommodated in a London Hotel. As numbers grew they were moved to Barnes Lodge, at that time part of the Shendish estate. They set up a radio and cypher group with radio links to resistance groups in Poland and also to Bletchley Park, though



they were not allowed to visit Bletchley Park. Further properties were acquired one of which was a large house with extensive grounds in Shothangar Way in Felden.

Of particular interest to Bovingdon was the story of Henryk Zygalski. He was a mathematician who had worked on an Enigma coding machine before the war and escaped via Vichy in France, Spain and Portugal reaching England in 1943. He lodged in Bovingdon and worked in the cypher unit in Shothanger Way. He passed over to Bletchley Park his manual method of cracking the Enigma code. After the war he remained in England and became a lecturer at Battersea Polytechnic.

The final lecture was given by Des Turner and entitled *The Special Operations Executive (SOE) at Aston House, the Frythe, Briggens and the Thatched Barn.* These were Hertfordshire houses, some of the more than 50 country houses requisitioned throughout England and Scotland by SOE. A large number were used for the selection and training of agents to be dropped into enemy occupied Europe. In addition, many houses were used to manufacture items needed to support the agents. Some



specialised in the manufacture of weapons such as exploding mice and cigars, and guns such as a Sten gun disguised as a walking stick and small suitcase. Other houses were clothing factories making hand-made clothes in the style and fabrics of the target countries. Due to the scale of SOE, one house in Hertfordshire became a printing factory, producing top quality forgeries of identity cards, travel warrants and ration books. Documentation on SOE was declassified in the 1990's and enabled our lecturer to carry out the very detailed research needed for this most interesting lecture.

beneared has heartex branded as Bovingdon Connect to emplease the service that we wish to provide and avoid confusion with any organisations providing personal or domestic care services. There will be no change in the service that we offer, which is to make volunteer-driver transport available to Bovingdon residents who have essential appointments at hospitals, clinics, surgeries and other facilities that they cannot easily reach by public transport. Although the original name will inevitably be used informally for some time and our publicity material is being updated gradually, the new name, Bovingdon Connect, is effective from now on.

Access to the service remains unchanged. Please call **Bovingdon Connect** on **07376 832999** between 09:30 and 12:30 on weekdays (or send a text message), ideally a few days before your appointment, to tell us where you need to get to and when. Our duty coordinator will then try to find a driver (or drivers) available to get you there and back. If it is the same driver doing the return trip, you can agree the timings and arrangements with them directly.

Whilst we don't charge for our service, we trust that users will want to make a voluntary donation towards their driver's expenses and the costs of providing the service. If in doubt, ask your driver to suggest an amount. Any direct costs for the journey, such as parking charges, should be paid by the user. Remember to bring your "blue badge" if you have one.

Our service is available on the basis that we are giving a lift to a friend or neighbour. Our drivers cannot be expected to be responsible for the passenger's physical or mental health, other than their normal duty of care to anyone travelling with them, although they will usually go beyond that. Anyone in need of a carer for everyday life should be accompanied by a carer when being transported by Boyingdon Connect.

St Lawrence Churchyard

As this edition of Bovingdon News is delivered, spring will be in full bloom in the Churchyard and will soon be giving way to summer. Indeed, the snowdrops were up and looking beautiful in January and February as evidenced by a number of photographic posts on Bovingdon Facebook. Daffodils were radiant in February and March and crocuses and native primroses were abundant too.

The 4.5 acre St Lawrence Churchyard is a living sanctuary for wildlife, unspoilt by agriculture and development and is maintained by an enthusiastic and dedicated team of volunteers who meet, COVID-19 permitting, on the first Saturday of the month throughout the year. Regular jobs are grass mowing, strimming, shrub trimming, pruning and the removal of self-seeded ash, holly, elder and the ever-present brambles.

At the time of writing, at the end of February, a number of individuals were planning for some exercise at the beginning of March to clear some end of winter debris and remove the last of the Christmas wreaths and decorations from graves.

There are records of over 1,700 graves but there have been many more burials down the ages as there has been a church on the site since the year 1200.

As the Prime Minister's route out of lockdown is followed, so the team will be able to meet in greater numbers and partake in refreshments through summer and into autumn. By the time summer arrives the team will be on top of grass mowing and strimming, apart from in the three managed wildflower areas in the north and north-east areas of the churchyard that are left untouched until August when one area is cut, followed by another in September and the third in October. Nothing is cut in these areas until the wildflowers have resown their seeds.

This year's snowdrops were prolific, and, at the time of writing, the greenery is above ground that should ensure a fine display of bluebells under the canopy of trees.

We continue to recycle as much churchyard waste as possible and rarely have more than one bonfire a year — and that is timed to co-incide with Bonfire Night.

There are times of the year, especially at the height of the growing season in summer, when a few more mid-week volunteers could take some pressure off the Saturday team. If you have some time and could spare an hour or two a month, or you would like to join the monthly gardening team in one of Hertfordshire's biggest and most beautiful churchyards, do please make contact: I'd be delighted to hear from you, and you would be made most welcome.



During the period from March to November 2020 nothing much took place due to the lockdown and restrictions imposed by the Government. We were frustrated by not being able to commemorate the 100th anniversary of VE



day or VJ day in traditional fashion, and nor could we support village events such as the Church Fête and the Dog Show with a gazebo presence, all of which would have normally collected up to £500 towards the annual poppy collection. The Remembrance Service in November also had to take place in the churchyard. However when the operational restrictions were eased by the government in the late summer and autumn, we were able to hold a limited poppy collection, and, led by the school, which collected over £700 pounds, and the shops, some of whom collected more than in any previous year, we collected over £3,200, which was an excellent outcome in the circumstances.

Our friends in Chipperfield did particularly well, so the overall total for the Sub-Branch was £9,810, which is only approximately. 10% below the average for the past five years in spite of no contribution from either the fireworks in Chipperfield or the Market on the airfield. I thank all the collectors, donors and individual contributors for their time, effort, and generosity in helping to achieve such a satisfactory result.

Now we have a roadmap set by the Government for the rest of this year it is for us to re-establish connection with those bodies who were unable to contribute in 2020 due to external factors but who will now be able to support us, and individually be mindful that there continue to be a large number of ex-military personnel and their families who need our support. We must also try and take full advantage of commemorating any special military events during the rest of the year as guided by the RBL.


