We are always in need of more volunteer drivers, particularly holiday times and also the school holidays when people are needed for Grandparent duties. So, if you have a car and some spare time perhaps you could become a volunteer driver. There are no set days, rosters or commitment. Most drivers do one or two runs a month, completely of their own choice. Requests are sent out using a WhatsApp group and you decide whether to accept the job—you can just say you are unavailable.

Volunteer driving and donations for expenses do not affect a driver's car insurance under current guidelines.

Chairman's Report

As I write this report, the thousands of daffodils that the Parish Council have planted over the preceding two years are about to flower. What a magnificent display they will make, truly confirming that spring has arrived. We are also hoping that a multitude of hanging baskets will be on show again this year, which should give an on-going colourful display in the High Street throughout the summer months.





I am pleased to report that a recent vacancy on the Parish Council was filled by co-option, and I am delighted to welcome Cllr Karen Bregazzi-Jones to our small but dedicated team of Parish Councillors. There is currently a further vacancy on the council for which we have received several enquiries. I would ask that anyone who may be interested in becoming a Councillor to contact the Parish Office by email at office@bovingdonparishcouncil.gov.uk or by phone on 833036. We would be delighted to chat through what would be involved and provide further information: this is an opportunity to make a meaningful impact on local decisions and initiatives.

There are number of events scheduled to take place in the village during the year, the first of which is the VE Day 80th Anniversary celebration that will take place on Thursday 8th May. At 9am there will be a flag raising outside the Memorial Hall, together with the reading of a proclamation by



Cllr Richard Roberts. Representatives from the British Legion, Parish Council, Church and Primary School will be in attendance and villagers will be most welcome to attend. In the evening there will be a cricket match on Bovingdon Green between Bovingdon and Chipperfield. The cricket club bar will be open to the public, and a variety of refreshments will be available including fish and chips and BBQ provided by Bovingdon Scouts. At approximately 9pm the Beacon on the green will be lit and the VE Day Tribute read out; this will then be followed by a firework display.



On 6th July there will be another Classic Vehicle display event on Bovingdon Green taking place between midday and 6pm. The event is being organised by the Bovingdon Community Events Team and it is expected that there will be over 250 classic vehicles on display. There will be entertainment and activities for all ages, a large variety of refreshments and numerous stalls

many of which will support various charities. The Community Events Team are also hoping to re-start the annual Christmas Fayre and Christmas Light Switch- On.

Planning Committee Update

In respect of planning matters, there have been no further significant planning applications received. Work is now well underway both at the Molyneaux Avenue site and at Grange Farm, where it is anticipated that construction of the new community facilities will commence later this year or in early 2026. We understand that the whole development is scheduled to be completed by the first half of 2027. Other major development projects in the village at the Bobsleigh Hotel and Bovingdon Brickworks have not yet commenced. Parking restrictions outside the main shops in the High Street have finally been put in place and should be operational from April. The proposals have been formulated to create a greater turnover of parking spaces to assist local businesses, as well as provide dedicated goods vehicle loading and disabled badge holder facilities.

County Report

Christmas was a welcome break after a frantic few weeks: plans were revealed for the future of Local Government and our budget setting went to the wire. Government has opined that the current two-tier system, operating perfectly well in



Hertfordshire, is to be replaced. Locally that means goodbye Dacorum Borough Council and Hertfordshire County Council to be replaced with single councils that do everything called Unitary Councils. Elected Mayors will sit on top, working closely with the rest of the public sector. Change is coming at breakneck speed but our top priority remains the delivery of over 500 vital services and that change must be for the benefit of residents and businesses: it could be a bumpy ride.

Money is tight: we took the decision last year to streamline our workforce and save as much as possible. Pound for pound we saved as much as we asked for in council tax. That huge savings effort meant we could protect and invest in what matters most, such as social care, libraries, waste centres and yes roads. No cuts, just trying to make the money go as far as possible. A big thank you to all our 8,000 staff who have not only had to deal with change but in many cases increased demand. The biggest areas of increase have been for children with Special Educational Needs, older residents needing some care at home, and children in our care needing specialist accommodation.

It's also rained a lot and that hasn't helped the roads much, you may have noticed! A new package to tackle flooding, drainage, potholes and edge of road repairs will kick in as frosts give way to drier weather and the summer programme can crack on. Vicarage Lane, Church Street, Shantock Hall Lane, Water Lane, and the far end of Chesham Road are all due for surface dressing this year, with the Hempstead Road pavement leading up to the crossroads being rebuilt. The top of the High Street is particularly busy and to connect across safely we are exploring putting in a new zebra crossing. Across the county over a thousand road schemes will be delivered this year, as we did last.

Most flooding in the village has been addressed through an on-going investment over the past ten years. The final piece of the jigsaw, flooding at the top of Green Lane, is planned to be resolved, as part of the Bovingdon Grange development.

Talking of development, I am increasingly concerned about the Government's increased number of mandated homes planned for the county, the watering down of greenbelt protection and less scrutiny of local planning decisions. The eye-watering increase for Dacorum is another 30%, St Albans is another 70% and, unbelievably, villages are more likely to be vulnerable to speculative development than towns.

By the time you read this the county elections, in which I am standing, may well be over. Can I thank you for the absolute privilege of being your County Councillor for the last four years. My thanks as well to all who work so hard for and with the village, often those creating the least fuss, seeking the least recognition and delivering the most. Happy 60th Ladybirds!

Anticipation is what keeps us gardeners motivated through the bleak winter months and, as I write this in early March, the longed-for spring sunshine has finally arrived. Now we can begin to prepare the soil, mow the lawn, and enjoy the emerging spring flowers



It seems a very long time since our last show on 14th September. Despite the topsy-turvy summer weather this was well supported by our members with 223 exhibits in classes for fruit and vegetables, flowers, floral art, cookery, preserves and home-made drinks. Competition was fierce and only two of the cups went to previous winners. Like all societies we need an injection of young blood and that does not come younger than our two



newest members who are aged four and six. Despite the fact that there were no children's classes to enter in the show (this has now been rectified!) they were not deterred, choosing to compete with the adults and were very successful. Well done boys for your determination, and I am sure we will see more of these youngsters at future shows.

Our final event for 2024 was our annual social evening in November. The quiz night staged in the Memorial Hall was a great success, not only entertaining the members but raising over £400. The money will help support our coming events and a donation will be made to the Hospice of Saint Francis for their garden.

There has been a lot of gloomy weather during this last autumn and winter so we are hoping to brighten our gardens with the help of Katharine Woods who was the speaker at the first of our spring talks. *Get The Exotic Look* was the title of her illustrated talk, which took place on 19th March. Sadly by the time you receive this magazine the talk will have been given but look out for more exotic plantings appearing around the village this summer! Our second talk on April 23rd was *The Use of Herbs* given by herbalist Lucy Blundell. As well as listening to her advice on growing and using herbs we had the opportunity to try some of her herbal teas.

News from St Lawrence

We were delighted to welcome large congregations to our services at Christmas and look forward to doing so again this Easter. Meanwhile our regular pattern of Sunday worship and mid-week activities continues, aiming to cater for all ages. A particular highlight is our work with young children and families: a weekly 30 minute informal Family Praise service, monthly groups for Explorers (7-11), older children (9-13) and Messy Church for families. If you or your children want to find out more about the Christian faith and what goes on at church, check our website for details, contact me at the address below, or just come along one Sunday — you will be very welcome.

We are still in full fund-raising mode for our 'Patience' project, aiming to raise a total of £1.6m to build an annexe on the church (replacing the hall in Vicarage Lane) and create a warm, flexible and welcoming space in the church itself. At the time of writing we have raised £970,000 and we are now appealing to the whole of Bovingdon to come out and support this exciting project, which will benefit church and community alike.

St Lawrence Hall in Vicarage Lane was sold on 30th April and we have worked with our hall users to find them temporary accommodation elsewhere. This sale means that we have now raised over 50% of what we need, and this enables us to apply for grants to several charitable trusts.

The St Lawrence Music Club is holding monthly concerts and musical events, both to raise funds for our 'Patience' appeal and also to highlight what a brilliant facility our church is for community events. We've had jazz, opera, the Community Choir, and classical song so far; we will continue with a variety of musical styles to suit all tastes.

Alongside this we have our usual events planned: our Church Summer Fête (Saturday 14th June), Hallowe'en Light Party (31st October) and Christmas Market (15th November). These are fun community events and we would love to see you there. We will also have a tea tent and craft activities at the Car Show on the green (6th July) and are grateful to the organisers for making our 'Patience' project one of the local groups to benefit from the proceeds of this event.

Whether you are new to Bovingdon, or have lived here for decades, and whatever your beliefs, you are always welcome to join us for one of our services or simply to call in (the church is open every day) for a few moments of peaceful contemplation.

The Friends of St Lawrence Church

The Friends of St Lawrence Church is a charitable trust and exists to help ensure the preservation of Bovingdon's Parish church and churchyard for current and future generations.



We are a registered charity that is independent from the Parochial Church Council (PCC) but we collaborate closely with it to fulfil our objectives, but we have decided to curtail our activities whilst St Lawrence is actively engaged in raising the money required for building its annexe. No doubt you will read more about this elsewhere in this publication.

We did, however, hold our annual coffee morning in May. As foretold it was held in Red Lion Cottage, hosted by Marion Perkins. We were blessed with a beautiful day which complemented her lovely garden. The Ladybirds turned out in strength and contributed to us raising £1,128, almost back to pre-pandemic levels.

Our 2024 Christmas card was also a success. Marion Perkins kindly donated a painting of the church, which we reproduced for the card. It was a beautiful card and, despite the general reduction in sending Christmas cards, all 1,500 were sold generating a surplus of £573 on sales.

During the year we donated £29,604 to St Lawrence Church. Of this figure, £24,331 was for the essential repairs to the troublesome south-east corner of the chancel. This brought our contribution to these repairs to £46,520: a lot of money but the work has now been completed. It has caused a massive reduction in our funds, carefully garnered over recent years.

Our reserves were down to just £13,435 at the end of December of which £5,000 is held for the maintenance of the churchyard. The reduction in our funds means that we will not be able to finance the much-needed redecoration of the interior of the church; this means this has now been delayed until the completion of the building project by which time we hope to have raised further funds.

On 13th May, we will be holding our annual coffee morning. This year it will hosted by Jane Caley at Maulden Orchard, which is just at the end of Long Lane. We look forward to seeing you there.

In common with other village undertakings the availability of volunteers is an on-going problem. People lead very busy lives these days and our regular volunteers are not getting any younger. We will be delighted to hear from anybody who would like to help us.

Since the last issue of Bovingdon News was published last November, much has happened within Bovingdon Cricket Club. At the AGM the same month, club stalwart and legend Mark Carine stepped down as secretary after 22 years and was honoured with the club's highest accolade. Lifelong



member Mark was appointed as a life-present in recognition of his service to the club that has played cricket in the village for more than 170 years. He joins his father, mother and brother in being honoured for their contribution to the club. Mark joins his father Les in the lifetime role that has only ever been awarded on 14 previous occasions. Mark's mother Janet and brother Peter are both vice-presidents.

Youth development officer Jamie Banner was appointed at the meeting to succeed Mark as secretary, and there was a bouquet of flowers for Nicola Hazelton who stepped down as club safeguarding officer after eight years.

St Lawrence Churchyard

As I write, it is 20th March — the Spring, or Vernal Equinox. The clocks will change soon and by the time you read this in late April or early May, the days will be getting longer, with lighter evenings and, more importantly perhaps, we will have warmer days as we head towards summer.

Spring is such a wonderful time of year: all that new growth bursting into life all around us, and especially in Bovingdon's 4.5 acre St Lawrence churchyard, which has been full of snowdrops, crocuses, daffodils, native pastel yellow primroses, wild hyacinth and is about to come alive under the canopy of the Austrian pines and ancient yews with a mix of English and Spanish bluebells.

Our first churchyard gardening session of the year was completed in March, tidying winter debris, and we moved into strimming and cutting mode in April. Chief lawn manager Paul Campbell had the sit-on mower in action today too for the first cut of the year; the main churchyard lawns always looks lovely when they've had a haircut. We are due a tree survey during April to ensure all trees are safe and well, and don't present a risk to the many people who find peace and tranquillity in the churchyard.

It's a big local community asset to keep neat and tidy, and we aim to achieve just the right balance — well-kempt, rural, but not overly manicured. If you are a regular user or have loved ones in the churchyard then I hope you agree that we usually have the balance just about right. If you have thoughts on the work the dedicated band of community volunteers carries out, or would like to join the gardening team, do make contact, as we are always in need of fresh arms and legs to keep on top of maintenance. My details are shown at the bottom of the page.

We meet on the first Saturday of the month for a maximum four hours from 9am-1pm with a tea/coffee and cake break at 11am. It's a good chance to have a catch-up with friends and villagers — and replace those calories burnt off during the morning.

I'm still on the look-out for another wheelbarrow if you have one redundant at the bottom of your garden, plus a couple of additional petrol-strimmer and lawnmower-owning volunteers to further strengthen the team. There's also the opportunity for anyone who would like to help start a mid-week team, as summer rain and sunshine really do make the grass, brambles, ivy, elder and self-seeded ash and holly grow... and all need dealing with throughout the gardening year.

The wild areas in the north-east corner are starting to grow — that's the area of the churchyard with many of the oldest graves and where we do not mow the grass until late summer and autumn so that the wildlife team can monitor the wild flowers and wild life.

As ever, I'll put out an appeal here to the dog owners — most are very responsible, but occasionally the churchyard team has to deal with a few deposits. As the signs at all three entrances state — please clear up after your pet
