## *Have your say on proposals for new homes in Bovington*

Taylor Wimpey is bringing forward proposals for a landscape-led extension to Bovington on land in the South East of the settlement.

We are proposing up to 140 new homes, including up to 50% affordable housing, together with new public open space. The scheme is being designed to integrate sensitively with the surrounding area, while delivering a range of benefits for both new and existing residents.

As part of our commitment to community engagement, Taylor Wimpey is sharing information about the proposals ahead of submitting a planning application to Dacorum Borough Council and inviting feedback from local residents.

## Key scheme principles:



Up to 50% affordable homes, alongside a mix of house types to support a balanced community.



Homes mainly comprising 2–2.5 storeys, designed to reflect the character of the area.



Public open green space including a central community green.



Sustainable drainage features, helping manage water while enhancing green areas.



Safe walking and cycling routes enhances connectivity to village amenities, schools and public transport in a highly walkable location.



New green corridors and habitats, supporting wildlife and improving biodiversity.



Shared open spaces, integrated play spaces, and a landscaped design including retained and enhanced vegetation will create a welcoming and connected community.

## Why are new homes needed?

Dacorum Council faces a clear and growing need for new homes, particularly affordable housing, to support people at all stages of life who wish to remain within their local community.

- House prices in the District are significantly higher than local earnings, limiting affordability.
- Young people and families are increasingly unable to access the housing market.
- Delivering new homes helps support community services and local businesses through job creation and increased spending in the local economy.

## Why here?

The site is bordered to the north and west by homes. This makes it a logical extension to the settlement and through sensitive design and landscaping it will form a new settlement edge to the South of Bovington. The site is also sustainably located, benefiting from:

- Walking distance to Bovington High Street and its range of amenities.
- Close proximity to schools, sports facilities and community uses.
- Convenient access to bus services connecting to Hemel Hempstead and wider rail links.
