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## Platinum Jubilee Community Celebration Grant

### What is the Platinum Jubilee Community grant?

In 2022, Her Majesty the Queen will become the first British Monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee: seventy years of service! An extended bank holiday, from Thursday 2nd to Sunday 5th June, will provide an opportunity for the people of Bovingdon to come together to celebrate this historic milestone. The Council wants to support local communities with their street party celebrations.

### Who can apply?

An individual or community organisation that is organising a party or celebratory event of at least 20 people in the Parish of Bovingdon, consisting of at least 4 separate residences in the Parish.

Businesses organising events commercially cannot apply.

### How much can we apply for?

The maximum grant that can be applied for is £50.

This can be used for food, drink, producing leaflets, party materials such as bunting, or entertainment.

If the scheme is oversubscribed, we will consider the following:

- The information provided in your application to the fund
- The level of deprivation in the neighbourhood where the party is taking place

### What are the grant conditions?

- This is a discretionary grant. All decisions by the council are final.
- The party must be within the Parish of Bovingdon.
- The party must take place during the Jubilee Bank Holiday weekend.
- The recipient of the grant must live within the Parish of Bovingdon.
- The applicant's name together with the names of three neighbours must be shown on the application.
- The applicant undertakes to invite all immediate neighbours.
- The grant will be collected in cash from the Parish Office and the applicant will bring proof of Bovingdon residency with a bill showing their home address within the last 3 months.
- The organiser must provide photographs or video of their event to the council and grant permission for the council to reuse the photographs or video.
- Information provided by applicants might be shared with ward councillors.
- The council reserves the right to recover the grant where there is evidence that it has been used for any purpose other than to which it was intended or if the organiser has failed to comply with any other condition of the grant.
- The applicant will refund the money if the party is cancelled.
- The applicant will undertake to clear up the street after the party.
- The council reserves the right to amend and vary these conditions at any time.

### How do I apply?

Please apply using the application form available on the Parish website or from the Parish Office or Library. The deadline is April 15<sup>th</sup>, 2022, and applicants will be informed of the outcome by 29<sup>th</sup> April. Funds will be paid out as soon as possible thereafter.
